# IV. Trustee's Report

#### Roof:

- More water damage has been discovered in the balcony
- The company that repaired the roof (local office of Reliable Roofing, which is now out of business), CA branch of the company is responding to the concerns about the poor roof repair job
- We have a conflict resolution company and an attorney supporting the process of getting the roof and the interior damage fixed

### Continued Work of Trustees:

- Do we have enough members to support the continued work of the Trustee's?
  Who is in our community that can step into these roles?
- Do we have our yard service clean up the leaves each fall if we don't have enough member volunteers?
- Do we have sign-ups so we know who is participating?

### V. Organ

- The person who repairs the organ is retiring; he has been performing monthly service on the organ
- o Is there someone else who can take on this work?
- What do people think about the continued use of the organ? (the piano is the primary instrument used in musical services)
- One of the remaining pipe organs in the PNW that remains in its original home
- According to the person who has been maintaining the organ, it needs about \$100,000 worth of work
- Ralph volunteers to take on the organ issue- meet with the organ repair person, include Tom Bell, get a better understanding of what concerns exists
- The idea of having organ concerts- what happened to that idea, can we revive this?
